"How's it going?"

"Fine, thanks. How are you?"

"Fine."

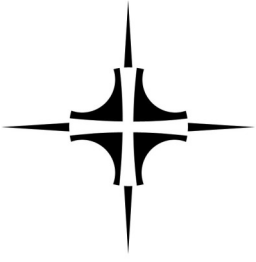
We all know these kinds of questions have become just shorthand greetings rather than invitations to conversation. In the midst of a busy morning we can often ask each other how we are without even slowing down to hear the answer. I wonder if we've lost something by asking, "how are you?" without expecting to stop and listen. My first year of seminary I had gone home for Thanksgiving weekend and on Thanksgiving morning received devastating news that a friend had passed away suddenly. That Monday morning when I returned to school a classmate asked me, "how was your weekend?" I decided to answer honestly, "it was awful." Without looking up from her book she said, "that's nice. How was the weather?"

Listening well is one of the best tools we have to help one another along through life's challenges. In telling our story and knowing we are being heard, a bond of love strengthens. Jesus told his followers the importance of hearing well (Matthew 13:15-16). The Apostle James told his congregation, "be quick to listen and slow to speak" (James 1:19). The Old Testament book of Proverbs says that to answer before listening is, "folly and shame" (18:3) but wise counsel from a friend, "brings joy to the heart" (27:9).

The most publically visible act of my own ministry is speaking: preaching the Word on Sundays or teaching in other settings. In less public ways my work involve listening as well. As I meet and visit with many of you outside of worship, I'm eager to hear your stories. In sharing both joys and sorrows we grow in both understanding and love. So I want to take this occasion to remind you that both Pastor Kari and I have an "open door" policy to meet with anyone who needs a listening ear. I keep daytime office hours on Tuesdays, Wednesdays, Thursdays, and some Fridays; but I am also very willing to meet on an evening or a weekend as it suits your schedule (also, please feel free to call or text me on my cell phone, but you may need to dial a "1" first if you call from your home phone).

The pastoral staff are not the only options for a designated place for care and counsel. We have *Befrienders*, a ministry of lay-people trained and gifted for listening (contact me for more info). Additionally, we have the wider resources outside our congregation including local networks of professional counselors and spiritual directors.

One of our critical success factors in the coming years is deepening our sense of community in this congregation. There is no better way to grow in our love for one another than taking the time to tell our stories, and trust that we are heard. Thanks for listening.

## Sundays at Bethlehem!

### Nursery

Nursery care is available for children birth-2 (turning 3) year olds for both services. For parents volunteering or in Sunday School, there is childcare available during the Sunday School hour too. Please consider volunteering to spend time with our smallest Bethlehem-ites.

### Sunday School

PreK (3 by 9/1/17)-5<sup>th</sup> grade meet from 9:45am-10:45am. 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> graders will begin upstairs in their classroom. PreK-3<sup>rd</sup> grades start in the Fellowship Hall for a time of singing. PreK & K will go to their own classroom at 10am for an age level lesson, snack and play. 1<sup>st</sup>-3<sup>rd</sup> stay together for Bible memorization, large group story time, reflection and then break into smaller groups for snack and age level activities. For safety, please have an adult pick up children ages Prek-2<sup>nd</sup> grade.

### Children's Church

Children age 3 (by 9/1/2017)- Kindergarten are invited to attend Children's Church during both services for a short Bible lesson and play time.

### Worship Bags

Worship bags and children's Bibles are available during both services to help children engage in the worship service. Please help us keep the bags organized by removing all used pages at the end of the service and keeping items in the bag they started in. Thank you!

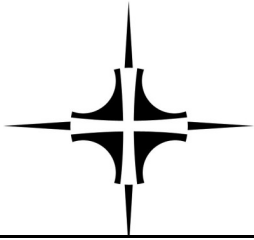
## Wish List Items for Kids'

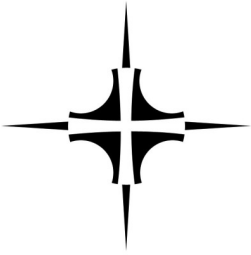

- October 25—Pulled Pork Sandwiches, Serving Group A

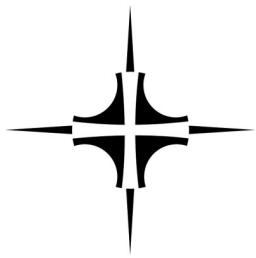

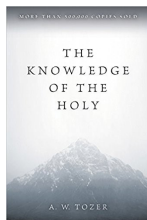

## Small Groups Begin October 15<sup>th</sup>!



Make new friends, deepen existing relationships, challenge your mind, and grow your faith. Bethlehem's reading/discussion groups meet twice/year, fall and spring, for six-week stretches. The groups are newly-formed each semester and are open to everyone.

This fall our book is *The Knowledge of the Holy*, by A.W. Tozer, a mid-20<sup>th</sup>-century Christian classic that addresses the question What is God like? Chapter One opens with the enticing words, "What comes into our minds when we think about God is the most important thing about us."

His language may now be outdated, but Tozer's ideas lose none of their meatiness; every sentence gives the reader something big to chew on. So come join the banquet! Beginning September 24, you can sign up in the Atrium for the small group of your choice. You will be asked to read approximately three pages/day, 20 pages/week, so that you can participate in a time of informal discussion with your group.

There are four different groups meeting Mondays, Tuesdays, Thursdays, and Saturdays, and each group will meet once a week, for six weeks.

## From the Childcare Director

Our school year has started out wonderfully. The children are busy practicing how to make friends, join others in play, to ask someone to join their play, and discovering how nice it is to have more than one friend. Some are working on using their voice to tell how they feel when confronted with something they wish were different. As we get to know these lovely little people we are excited at the opportunity to work with their families to come up with a plan to move the child along in developmentally appropriate ways.

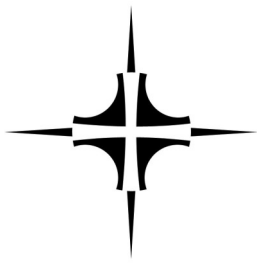
Between 1:00 and 3:00 Fellowship Hall is a quiet zone. You'll find 40 children who are quietly napping or at least *most are quietly* resting on their cots. After rest/nap time these children are split into two groups and do activities based on a study the afternoon teachers have planned. On most days, there are only a handful of children who do not rest and as the year moves along we'll see more and more of those almost Kindergarten children who no longer need to rest each day. Most days that will be fine, but, of course, there will be those days where we all now a short little rest of the brain would have been beneficial.

The school age classes are another incredible group ranging in grades K - 5. This year has brought us full enrollment with 48 students who come after school throughout the week, 41 each afternoon! The staff have reported that everything has started out so smoothly again this year. The children are all getting to know the routines, they are kind to each other, and invite new people to join in their play, friendships continue to grow and new friendships are just beginning. This year there are five Release Days between mid-October, and the beginning of November. The staff are planning fun field trips for the children to participate in while they are here at BCCC for those Release Days: possibilities are going to Fort Snelling, bowling, down to the Mississippi River, and an orienteering excursion.

On September 26 BCCC will host an Ice Cream Social for our families. We are hopeful that this year the weather will be pleasant so we can hold our social outside and let the families join their children in exploring the play area. It is much easier for families to move and mingle outside. It can be tricky estimating how many buckets of ice cream we'll go through with the 95 families that could potentially come. We welcome people from church to attend as well, it could be a nice way to begin relationships with some of the childcare families. The social is from 6 p.m. to 7 p.m.
